

GRAND KNIGHTS LETTER JULY 2021

Worthy Brothers, Families, Squires and Roses,

COVID-19

As I write this letter, the State of California has moved to a mostly open operating level. The new public health order which became effective on June 15, 2021, includes ending restrictions on physical distancing, capacity limits on businesses and removing the county tier system. The order has limited restrictions, only related to masking and mega events, as well as settings serving children and youth.

The California Department of Public Health (CDPH) has stated those individuals who are fully vaccinated are not required to wear face coverings outside or indoors except in certain conditions. Those who are unvaccinated should wear face coverings when indoors.

It further states restaurants, shopping malls, movie theaters and most everyday places will be open as normal with no capacity limits or social distancing required. It recommends we continue to protect ourselves by keeping common-sense rules in mind:

- Do Wear a mask if you're unvaccinated, especially in crowded, indoor spaces.
- Do Get tested if you are sick.
- Do Wear a mask while on public transit, even if you are vaccinated.
- Do Honor mask and distancing rules in place at a private business.
- Don't Expect others to be ready to shake hands or hug.
- Don't Lose your proof of vaccination.
- Don't Think you can't get the virus or pass it along because you feel well or are vaccinated.
- Don't Assume everyone is vaccinated.
- Don't expect all Covid-19 rules everywhere to be lifted.

As of this writing, the Diocese of San Diego and the Mission San Luis Rey Parish are developing procedures to deal with the reopening and how it affects us.

You may be asking yourself why I am spending so much space on Covid-19. The goal during the start of the 2021-2022 Fraternal Year is for the Council to move into a hybrid environment which supports the reopening requirements and the need to still protect others. I am working hard on bringing us back into the Knights Hall at the July 7, 2021, General Meeting. I am also working on being able to simultaneously broadcast the meeting via Zoom from the Hall.

The second reason I am spending time on Covid-19 is to ensure you that if you are vaccinated and want to wear a face covering at the meeting, it is fine and appropriate. If you are unvaccinated and should wear a face covering, we are not going to check to see if you have a card. I am using the honor system.

FRATERNAL YEAR 2021-2022

I would like to take a moment to introduce myself to all of you. Most of my family became members of the Mission San Luis Rey Parish in July 1992 after we moved into Oceanside. Our eldest son decided to stay in Lancaster, CA and do his own thing. Cheryll and I have four children and we have five grandchildren. I joined this Council in February 1994 with my 1st Degree Exemplification.



Our youngest children were altar servers and our daughter taught Religious Education for elementary school children for several years. I also taught Religious Education for Grades 6-12 for 18 years. In 2001-2002, I was elected Grand Knight.

A fellow Knight wanted to know what our theme was going to be for 2021-2022. Considering the impact from the pandemic, I think the theme is Reopening. Grand Knight Armando Mena had a difficult but successful year leading the Council through 2020-2021. I thank him and his officers for a job well done.

In addition to moving back into the Knights Hall, Reopening includes trying to do some of the events from the past. We have the Chili Cook-off, the Shrimpfest and the Golf Tournament on the calendar. They represent things from our past. We also want to include things from last year. Continuing with Rosaries and prayers and other religious activities are also the goal. The Council will continue to work with the Parish to support its Pastoral Plan.

FLEXIBILITY AND TRADITION

Finally, I would like to let you know we will embrace the traditions for the Council's past while engaging in the Council's future. It is good to know where you came from while acknowledging where you need to go.

PAST GRAND KNIGHT'S NEWSLETTER JULY 2021

Worthy Brothers, Squires and Roses, Parishioners, and Families,

We ended the year on many high notes.

- We finished the year collecting over 7,000 pounds of food through Foods for Family.
- All our four program areas placed in the top ten for our division in the state: 7th Family, 7th Faith, 5th Community and 3rd in Culture of Life.
- We qualified for Star Council.
- We participated in one of the largest Catholic relief efforts in the San Diego Diocese assisting to feed over 2,000,000 meals though the Emergency Food Network during the continuing pandemic.
- We were the base of operation for the First Responders Program LISTOS through SD Catholic Charities and the California State Office of Emergency Services contacting over 50,000 through 56 parishes about emergency preparedness.
- More importantly we prayed as a council with our families, parish and even led our diocese in one Multi-Cultural Rosary for Life. We had two KofC masses one led by San Diego Bishop Ramon Bejarano. In all we prayed over 5,000 hours.
- We continued to live our mission to evangelize youth with our Squire/Roses project (which always pays us back in spades) and provided the parish with Catechists.
- We made the June 2021 issue of Columbia Magazine.

THANKS, thanks, gracias to the 2020-2021 team of Sage Chavez, Richard Hirasuna, Gilbert Alvarez, Henry Beazley, Andrew Diaz and Don Watters. There were many Knights who stepped up and played important roles and who braved the Corvid 19 virus to help their neighbor. Thank you, brothers. Special thanks to Fr. Oscar and Fr. Sam for their support of our council.

Because of this parish team, I was able to lead and assist the diocese chapter and win the 2020-2021 San Diego Diocese Knight of the Year. Many thanks to you and to my wife Tina who when I told her the council needed to make a contribution to Religious Education she made and sold masks so we could contribute \$810 for our first communion and confirmation programs.


