GRAND KNIGHTS LETTER OCTOBER 2021

Worthy Brothers, Families, Squires and Roses:

October is often referred to as Rosary Month. Unfortunately for the Council, we still don't have a Faith Director so the only Rosary we have scheduled is on Sunday, October 31st. At this time, it is uncertain if it will be held or broadcasted.

We start the month off with on October 2 with a food sale in support of the St. Francis Pet Blessing event in front of the Mission. It will be a very similar activity to the August 27th sale where hamburgers and hotdogs were cook and sold. Hopefully, we will have enough volunteers to support the activity.

The Council is planning on having a social before the Council Meeting in October. It will be held on Wednesday, October 6th at 6:00 PM followed by the Council Meeting at 7:00 PM. It is a spaghetti dinner. Please RSVP to me as soon as possible so we can plan on how many meals we need to make.

Since our WiFi signal and Internet access is so weak in the Knights hall, we have suspended broadcasting over Zoom. We will continue to research the problem. We will hold the meetings live in the Knights hall and face coverings are recommended but not mandated.

Sunday, October 10 at 10 AM Mass is Corporate Communion Sunday in the Serra Center.

PGK David Diaz, Jr. has volunteered to chair the Coats for Kids program. The intent of the program is to work with a public school and have the school staff's assistance in identifying children of various grades who would benefit from getting a new coat for winter. We do not photograph or identify the children when they are presented with the clothing.

October also brings us the annual Intellectual Disability Drive also called the ID Drive. This will be held on the weekend of October 22-24. The Council has found a very energetic chairman in BK Joe Giardana. He has contacted at least 7 stores and continues to line up locations where we can ask for donations. Due to Covid 19 restrictions, we will not have candy to distribute. However, we can still advertise and collect donations. BK Joe will be needing volunteers at all the locations.

Due to other fiscal obligations the Parish has on the weekend of October 22-24, we are hoping to be able to collect donations outside the worship spaces (Mission and Serra Center) after the Masses on the following weekend, October 30-31.

We have planned to return to holding the Shrimpfest on February 25, 2022, in the St. Francis Hall. While the event is five months away, it needs a chairman. It doesn't have to be a traditional format and thinking outside the box is encouraged. This is our biggest money-making event of the Fraternal Year, and it funds many of our charity works including Parish projects. Please think about being the chairman and volunteering to support this event. I will continue to post information about this event in future editions of the Crusader.

Speaking of chairmen, BK Stephen Kimball has volunteered to be the Chairman for the Chili Cook-Off event. Even though it is planned for May 13, 2022, Stephen has started the planning process. Of course, as with all the Council's activities, he will need volunteers to make the event happen. I will keep you posted about what BK Stephen is working out. Lastly, I attended a meeting organized by the Parish Pastoral Council and attended by the Heads of Parish Ministries. It was held on September 25 in the Parish Dining room. It was a full house. Representing the Pastoral Council, Yvonne Hansen was the presenter and Jim Moore assisted her. Fr. Oscar, Fr. Sam and Fr. Alberto were also present.

- c. Objective 3: Support and enhance the Cultural and Diversity Council to create more social contacts between parishioners from different cultural groups to build a greatersense of unity among all parishioners.
- d. Objective 4: Provide formation and preparation so parishioners may better engage inmulticultural liturgies.


The theme is Reset and Renewal.

We have the activities and project that Supreme charges the Council to do and we have the need to support the activities within the Parish. As an example, I requested all the Knights in the room to stand up. There were 8 of us in the room. I pointed out that they all represented other ministries and yet were members of the Knights. There will be future meetings to explore how our ministry (Knights) supports the Pastoral Plan.






