250 Hours of Adoration



Pray a Holy Hour

Organize HolyHours with the goal of spending a total of 250 hours in Eucharistic adoration. If planning overnight adoration, council members should sign up to ensure every hour is covered with at least two members. Each person in attendance counts for one hour. You can also organize a Eucharistic procession on Corpus Christi Sunday. Host the Pilgrim Icon Program

Aspart of the Pilgrim IconProgram, host a **Sacred Heart Holy Hour**, which includes readings from Sacred Scripture and reflections from Pope Francis on the Sacred Heart of Jesus, as well as the Divine Mercy Chaplet, prayers to the Sacred Heart, and time for silent prayer and adoration of the Blessed Sacrament. These prayer services can be held with or without the icon of the Sacred Heart of Jesus.

Family Home Enthronement of the Sacred Heart of Jesus

Following your Holy Hour, distribute materials for families to enthrone an image of the Sacred Heart of Jesus in a place of honor in their homes, renewing their commitment to be faithful disciples and consecrating themselves to Jesus' Most Sacred Heart.

Plan a Day of Service

Identifythe biggest needsin yourparish and wider community and carry out acts of mercy and service. Suggested activities include:

- Assemble and distribute care packages for the homeless.
 - Visit kofc.org/encounteringthepoor for a three-part video with insights and practical tools for serving those most in need.
- Volunteer at a local food bank or collect non-perishable food items for the hungry
 - Through the [Food for Families](#) program, for every \$500 or 1,000 lbs. of food donated, the Supreme Council will refund the council \$100 (up to \$500 max)
- Coach, officiate or provide general support for Special Olympics events
- Clean the grounds of your local school, parish, cemetery or seniors' homes in your area
- Host a blood drive
- Collect flags and conduct flag retirement ceremonies

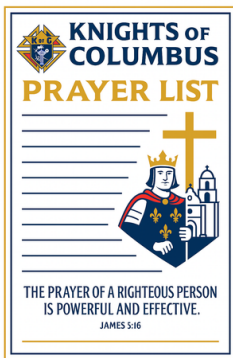

FATHER MCGIVNEY GUILD KEEPING THE FAITH

Father mcgivney not only lived a life devoted to the catholic faith; he also focused all his spiritual, mental and physical energies on helping others persevere and grow in that faith, and he guarded against whatever might diminish the practice of catholicism.

For father mcgivney's newly formed knights, protecting the faith of catholics was the prime concern, and this quickly took three forms. First, the knights would serve as an antidote to those secret societies that lured catholic men away from their faith by offering financial benefits.

Second, the order's insurance program would help keep catholic families together when a breadwinner died; this would also help prevent a loss of faith among widows and orphans forced to live in state institutions or with non-catholic relatives or adoptive families.

Third, the knights would champion the full rights of american citizenship for catholics. This, too, would support the church, since ensuring equal rights for catholics would help limit the social or civil pressure on them to abandon their faith.
